Dear Friends,

In normal times, the United Methodist Church meets every 4 years for what is called our General Conference. About 1,000 delegates from all over the world convene for several days of worship and Bible study, but also to discuss the big issues facing our denomination.

These General Conferences are usually held during Presidential election years, so the latest one was scheduled to be in Minneapolis in April 2020. However, because of Covid, it was postponed until this year. But, alas, again it has been pushed back. While much of life in the United States has returned to near normal, since so many delegates come from around the world, and with international travel still restricted and difficult, it was thought best to postpone it for yet one more year.

I tell you all this because the United Methodist Church is facing some critical issues right now. Most visible, and probably most important, is the issue of homosexuality within the church. Expected to come up at the next General Conference is a proposal to split the United Methodist Church into 2 separate denominations, one that accepts and includes the LGBTQ community, and one that does not. Each individual local church will then have the opportunity to choose for itself which denomination it will join.

All of this has been postponed, as I say, until next year because of the pandemic. Minneapolis is now scheduled to host the next General Conference August 29-September 6, 2022.

You'll be hearing more about this as we go forward, especially after the first of the year. Pastor Doug and I are already working on ways to bring discussion to the congregation surrounding (1) what is at stake in all this, (2) the decision-making process for the local church and (3) an attempt to understand the Biblical perspective. So stay tuned . . .



## Ministry Update

It is July so it's time for a six month check up on how our ministries are doing now that things are opening up more. First, I would like to thank all of you for continuing to support SUMC with your very generous gifts to **Faith Promise**.

The **blood mobile** will continue as scheduled on **November 13, 2021**. The February and April blood drives yields impacted a total of **60 Indiana lives** being impacted. We do not know how many units were collected in the July blood drive yet.

We hope to be bringing back **community meals** in the next few months. Stay tuned for updates on that coming back.

**Feed A Need (F.A.N.)** continues to provide 50 meals per month for **Tear Down the Walls Ministry (TDWM).** So far this year **350 meals** have been distributed. September 23, 2021 this ministry will celebrate its one-year anniversary. So far this ministry alone has provided **406 meals** to the homeless population in Marion county.

**God's Will Breakfast** continues to serve the population at **Fletcher Place**. The **Harvest Table** continues to serve fresh vegetables to the local community as well as **Hunger**, **Inc.** 

**Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN)** will be returning to SUMC on **October 10-17, 2021.** There will be opportunities for SUMC to show its love for God and those in need very soon.

The Jubilee Christmas Team will be gearing up in November to support families at Homecroft Elementary School at Christmas.

We are waiting to hear about when our **Kairos ministries** will resume. We hope it will be soon.

Ronald McDonald House (RMH) is now allowing volunteers to assist with meals on a limited basis. July 2, 2021 a team of four individuals cooked a meal with the guidance of the chef and was able to provide approximately 40 meals to the families with loved ones at Riley Children's Hospital.



Games 1:00 p.m. - 2:30 p.m.


Games will be self-directed and will include Yard Jenga, 9 Square, Crochet, Tattoos, 3-Legged Race and more.

We hope to collect enough to hit the \$1000 mark for helping with the "What If Campaign" that focuses on paying down the church mortgage.

#### Food Pantry

The Hunger, INC food pantry located at Epler and Madison Avenue is relying on donations right now since the Food Banks have slowed down with their donations. And the school drives do not happen until November-December.

## Finance

Pastor Doug recently asked each of us during a Thursday night teaching service if we were a glass half empty or a glass half full kind of person. Someone pointed out that the glass is always full, its half liquid and half air. I kind of like this perspective, however, when I think about what I am, I am not any of these. I'm a "I'm thankful for what is in the glass, but want to plan for how we finish filling it" kind of person. As I look at where SUMC is financially mid-year, I certainly am very thankful for how full our cup is.

Your giving makes a difference. It means projects like replacing two outdated/malfunctioning heating & cooling systems in the west wing can be done timely and without having to worry about how full our cup is. It means we can focus on ministry rather than worrying about how we are going to fill our cup. It means we can fill the cup of others through worship, outreach, and service.

Another thing I am thankful for is the progress that is being made on the What if... Debt elimination campaign. Since this campaign began in April I have had the privilege of signing, on your behalf, four checks totaling \$207,300 that all went directly to reduce the principal of our debt. That is a lot of debt eliminated in just four months! Thank you!

Thank you for not making us have to worry about how full our cup is!
