Dear friends,

The official season of fall begins Wednesday, September 22nd. But things we typically associate with fall have already begun. Family vacations are likely over by now. Students are back in school (and have been for a month now). Labor Day is coming soon which means that you can't wear white anymore. (Is that still a rule?) And soon, Daylight Savings Time will end (BUT NOT UNTIL NOVEMBER 7TH). As the saying goes, "spring forward and fall behind," we move our clocks back an hour in the fall.

Galations - THE MAGNA CARTA OF SPIRITUAL LIBERTY!

According to some scholars, the book of Galatians in the New Testament was one of the first books written. It was written by the Apostle Paul to the churches in Galatia – the churches that were started by Paul on his first missionary journey.

Christianity was in danger of becoming just another sect of Judaism had Paul not written that letter. (Let that statement sink in a minute.)

According to theologian John MacArthur, the book of Galatians has been given such titles as "the Magna Carta of spiritual liberty, the battle cry for the Reformation, and the Christian's declaration of independence." In fact, it is said that the foundation of the Reformation was laid with the writing of Martin Luther's commentary on Galatians. John MacArthur also called this letter to the Galatians a "flashing sword wielded by a burning heart."

Get the picture? Galatians is a very important letter and is foundational for our faith.

In late October/early November, I am going to preach on the letter to the Galatians. For three weeks, we will look at the letter and uncover what it has to say to us. (We won't have time to talk about each verse in these three sermons, so I would encourage each of you to read the entire letter on your own during that time.)

Don't miss a single sermon as we unpack Paul's letter, "written from the grieving heart of a godly man for his spiritual children, whose faith and living were being undermined by false teachers."
