So much to be done and time passes so quickly. Yes, we have all of September, October and November, yet we don't want to waste a day when we have an opportunity to share Jesus' love with others.

ONE OF THE MOST JOYFUL EXPERIENCES OF JUBILEE IS HOSTING A FAMILY. Your personal contact with a family makes all we do have a caring and personal touch. There are phone conversations and sometimes texting. Planning together what their family needs are and choosing "surprise gifts" for the children. On Jubilee Day hosts and families meet to wrap and prepare the gifts to take home.

Last year we served over 20 families because of the generous donations from the church family and the personal connections of 20 Jubilee Hosts, each working with one family. Due to life changes and other commitments, we find that we have the chance to invite and include new people to hosting. As we contacted Homecroft Elementary to begin selecting families, we were only able to invite 13 to participate.... so far. Our goal is to serve at least 20, if not more. There are so many daily essentials we can assist in providing.

PLEASE CONSIDER HOSTING A FAMILY THIS YEAR. With 7 to 10 additional hosts, we will offer not only gifts and needs being met, but a loving connection with families who are facing difficult times.

What If Fundraiser Update

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I am currently preparing a sermon titled "Toy Box Gospel". Depending on when you are reading this you may or may not have already heard it. Anyway, I have toys on the brain, so right now our finances are kind of making me think of a yo-yo. Our bottom line keeps going up and down, and that's not always a bad thing.

Our giving remained consistent. But we had a couple of expenses that, while planned, we just don't have every month. Those expenses were a new HVAC unit and new computer/software for the Worship Center.

You may also notice that Imagination Station is showing a rare red for its monthly pottom line. That's due to a spike in payroll that we see a couple of times a year due to how the payroll calendar falls. So, again, expected.

So, yes, like a yo-yo our bottom line is going up and down, but that's not really the

comparison I'm trying to make. Like our Church two things make a yo-yo work.

The first yo-yo to church comparison is the body. For a yo-yo to do what it is supposed to do some "body" must consistently perform the same motion to make it keep moving. For the church "the body" (that's me and you) must provide consistent support with their time, talent, and financial resources.

The second yo-yo to church comparison is momentum. There must be consistent momentum for the yo-yo to keep going. If the person yo-yoing stops the yo-yo will go up and down a few more times and then rest at the bottom of the string. Of course, our Church works in the same way. If we do not have support coming in, then there is no momentum to keep our facilities and ministries going.

Unlike, the yo-yo, we don't rely only on one individual. We have a strong body made up of many individuals and families that support the church in amazing ways. However, each of us should regularly prayerfully consider how else we might be able to support the church be it giving financially or through serving with your time and talent.

Thanks for all you do and all you give. Let's keep the momentum going so we can keep reaching out into this world with Christ's grace and hope. And if we do that, we will keep growing in ways that bring honor and glory to our Lord and Father.
