#### A SIMPLE INVITATION

Dear Friends,

What was your first introduction to the church, either Southport United Methodist Church, or some other church? Maybe it was recently, or maybe it was a long time ago. Do you remember the first time you came to a new church? Were you just a little child and your parents were bringing you? Or maybe you were a teenager or adult and coming to a new church or returning after not having been to church for a while.

My guess is that you came to church, whether it was for the first time, or returning after being away, as the result of an invitation from someone. Someone whose advice you respected and trusted, maybe someone whose life was setting a good example, invited you – and you came!

My experience over the years is that most people who come to church come as the result of an invitation from someone. Survey after survey shows that the best form of advertising that a church has, is not a slick marketing campaign, on TV or in the newspaper or Facebook or other social media, the best way to advertise and build a church is through a simple invitation from the members and friends of that church.

This month of December, this season leading up to Christmas, is the perfect time for you to extend a simple invitation to another person, or several, to a family, or several, to come to church with you. They might be thinking about their spiritual lives already, and the need to find out for themselves what a church is all about. They might respond right away to an invitation.

So my simple invitation to you is this: Extend yourself, invest yourself, reach out just a little bit more than might be comfortable and offer an invitation to someone to come with you on a Thursday night or Sunday morning or perhaps to one of our services on Christmas Eve. And then see what happens. See what God might do in that person's life through that simple invitation!

Thank you for being part of the Jubilee Ministry and sharing Jesus' love with all!



We will be holding a new member class on December 3 at 11:45 in the music room!

Hello!

Yes, we have served breakfast every month this year. During Covid we also served, but my dining room became the Fletcher place annex. Luckily I have 4 kids! We made 125-150 sack lunches and delivered them every month. I December of 2021 we began making hot meals at Fletcher again, but for safety we were not allowed to serve them. They were initially served from a doorway of the building, then from an outside stand closer to our population. Eventually, a new venue was obtained, and we now serve in person again at Southeast Community Services. The kitchen we use is in rough shape, so we have all donated various small appliances to make it work. Our numbers have been increasing every month, until we are now almost back to our pre-covid numbers. Last month we served 143!

We serve a hot meal as well as cereal and fruit, plus extras like muffins and granola bars depending on what is available. For many of our folks it is the only food they will have all day, so I try to fill their bellies and send them with something for later. We have many regulars and the word has gotten out so we have more new friends each month! My volunteers vary each month. All four of my kiddos volunteer as they are able, and I also have Edie and Janet from SUMC when they are able. Occasionally other folks from SUMC are able to help. My daughter is able to recruit help occasionally from work,

and I am working on some nurses from Riley. It always works out! Last month we served 143 with just myself and two of my boys! As far as cost, we are blessed to have an incredibly generous church family at SUMC! Cost of food has almost doubled post Covid but I've never yet been asked to scale back my purchases! Now that we are serving more folks again we average around \$400 per month, not including a few things unavailable at GFS that I purchase and donate. If it helps for your tracking, we serve on the 3rd Friday of each month, and I pick up supplies from GFS the day before.

I cannot thank you enough for supporting this important ministry! We share fellowship as well as food with those who desperately need us. It has been my blessing to serve this ministry for over 10 years now. Initially I purchased supplies, then gradually began to serve along with my family, and then took over as ministry leader when Billie Hunteman moved away. As always with ministry, I receive much more than I give!

The Hunger, Inc food pantry is starting their 41st year of serving the neighborhoods of Perry Township, part of Beech Grove, and Franklin Township. The pantry is open 3 days a week and services as many as 500 families each month.

The Meijer Simply Give Campaign at the Southport Road store is still collecting money for the pantry. YOUR \$10. can become \$30. So donate your money in an envelope on the collection table by the bathrooms. Be sure to put your name on the envelope and place it in the offering plate. The double donation day is December 16th. Your money will be taken to the store for you to help buy food to feed the many clients in need of food. Thank you for supporting the pantry for many years.

#### **FEED A NEED**

**The FAN** team will be bagging the 50 meals to feed the unhoused in downtown Indianapolis. The team will gather on Tuesday, December 5th (this is a change of our normal day) at 1:00 pm in the Gathering Area at church to bag the sacks going out to those in need of food. This is a 30 minute activity and anyone is welcome to come help.

#### **CREATION CARE**

Christmas is here and presents are being wrapped. Remember that most wrapping papers are able to be recycled. They need to not be glossy and made from foils and fuzzy. Others are able to be recycled. Collect them at Christmas activities in a paper sack from the grocery store and take them to the recycle bins located at the corner of Madison Ave. and Edgewood Ave. in front of Bandy car repair business. Also many of the packaging material around toys and boxes (flattened) can be recycled.

Also remember that there are many items that can be recycled from the Advent Dinners. Bins are located at the East end of the Gathering Area. CLEAN-- Plastic cups, plasticware, and plates and napkins. God's creation needs all our help to survive for the future.





After December 31, we will no longer have our recycling Container in the back parking lot. If this is a container that you use on the regular, please make arrangements for the beginning of the year. Kroger on Madison is a close alternative.
