

General Conference

Dear Friends,

As I am writing this here toward the end of April, something called the General Conference of the United Methodist Church is happening. It is a meeting of the entire denomination, and it is taking place in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Ordinarily, the General Conference meets every 4 years, but because of Covid and the restrictions and difficulties of international travel for some delegates, the General Conference originally scheduled for 2020, was postponed not once, or even twice, but three times. Finally, with the postponement in 2022, it was determined that the next General Conference would take place at the regularly scheduled place and time in 2024.

However, during that spring of 2022, some United Methodist leaders and churches were upset over the postponement of General Conference, because some real issues about the future of the denomination, principally related to homosexuality, were not being considered and decided, and many churches left the denomination to form a new church called the Global Methodist Church.

So the long-delayed General Conference is finally taking place from April 23-May 3. There is a lot to be discussed and decided and celebrated with regard to the United Methodist Church. You may be hearing a few things from various sources about what has happened during those 10 days, but you may want to hear more, and make sure that you are getting information from reliable sources.

One informative session to let you know all about General Conference and answer any questions you might have is being held on Saturday, May 11, 2024, at Meridian Street United Methodist Church, 5500 North Meridian Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46208, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This is part of the larger Lay Speakers Academy that day at the same location that Brandon has helped to organize. (He is also teaching one of the courses!) You can choose to take one of these excellent courses and learn more about General Conference or go to one event or the other.

So, there are things happening in the United Methodist Church, all of which are interesting, and some of which you might feel are critical to the future. And here is one chance for you to learn more about it – at Meridian Street United Methodist Church, 5500 North Meridian Street, on May 11, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Southport United Methodist Church Ministries were once more easily denoted as Partnership, Communal or Connectional. We have found that our ministries frequently cross the lines as a ministry moves from connectional to more communal as well as from partnership to more communal.

Partnership – most of our partnerships are mutual ministry between SUMC and the local community, but may be the world community.

Communal – members serve in a way that reaches out to the community so that others might connect go God through Jesus Christ. These service areas reach into places where people may never attend a church but may just need a caring presence and a Christian example.

Connectional – comprises several vital ministries active at SUMC.

Jubilee In July

A Jubilee in July event is our way to begin planning and preparing for Jubilee Christmas 2024. We hope you can attend worship service July 18th/21st and 25th/28th. This is an opportunity for "Information, Input, and Invitation."

INFORMATION – whether Jubilee Christmas is a new experience for you or you are familiar with the ministry, the Jubilee Team will be available to share the scope of this outreach and answer questions. Who do we serve? What are the ways to participate? What does it mean to host a family?

INPUT – we are eager to hear your thoughts on how participating in Jubilee Christmas works best for you. What are the shopping and support options? Do you enjoy shopping online or in the store? What are the ways to contribute to the ministry (cash, gift cards, through your church account)?

INVITATION - July is a great time to stock up on all those needs for back to school and it is a good time to buy the types of things all children need (underwear, socks, blankets, etc.). We hope to take advantage of the sales. At the Next Steps area in the Gathering Place, we will provide a few tags for shopping. Any items bought at this time will be made available to the children as needed and for Jubilee Christmas.

Because of your generosity we were able to serve 15 families and over 60 children and youth in 2023. We continue to have a great need in our community. With 2-5 additional hosts we will increase our outreach. Please mark your calendar for Jubilee in July, we invite you to bring your questions and offer your input.

PANTRY NEWS

THANK YOU AGAIN FOR HELPING WITH DIAPERS LAST MONTH.

This month we are collecting the following items from Thurs. May 2nd ---Sun.

May 12th: Rice packets and noodle packets (like Knorr or store brands)

Mashed potato packets or boxes of potatoes (like AuGratin or Scalloped)

We are now averaging around 50+ clients each day we are open.

The pantry is open 3 times a week: Tuesday 10-1 Thursday 4-7 and Saturday 10-1

The pantry is always in need of grocery bags to pack items in after the clients shop. If you have bags to offer, place them in the coat hallway in the last cubby. Hang them on a hanger and they will be collected to take to the pantry...thank you.



Remember we have a recyle center in the Gathering Area for many items that can be recycled like plastics, cans, glasses, flags (flag ceremony in Southport in June) and more. Check out the area. The collection area is located on the East wall of the Gathering Area near the Kitchen.

There is also a collection area on Madison Ave. north of the church in front of the small mall area on the corner of Edgewood. This area takes larger items and is sponsored by the city.

There is a free shredding event coming up on Saturday, July 22nd from 10-2 at the Irvington Library Branch. They will take paper and electronics. Mark your calendars.
