Finance

Pat Hulfachor (our LT chair) and I got to do something really cool today. We went to a luncheon to receive a grant on behalf of Southport UMC from Metro Ministries, Inc. The grant is \$2,000 and it is to help us start a new ministry called Caring for our Community (keep your ears open about more of that soon). And we were not alone. Fourteen other United Methodist Churches and organizations also received checks for what sounded like some amazing programs and ministries. The total amount given out was over \$33,000!

But it got me thinking. What about the organizations that didn't receive grants? I'm sure there were some great ones that didn't make the cut. And now, what type of responsibility do we have to not only Metro Ministries, their donors, but also, these other organizations? Oh, and don't forget God! The pressure was almost enough to make me want to hand the check back (I did not). That responsibility is called stewardship.

Stewardship is a word taken from the Gospels, and not just from the Gospels, but from the lips of Jesus. This is what Jesus says in Luke's Gospel: "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward." (16:1-2)

"Steward" and "stewardship" mean to administer what belongs to someone else.

Nowadays we might use a term like "money manager." When a person gives their savings over to a money manager, it's clear who owns what. The money doesn't belong to the money manager, it is entrusted to them. They may get some of it, but the money belongs to the person who gave them the money. Imagine how off based it would be if a money manager took all the money and acted as though it belonged to them to spend as they alone wished to spend it. That is the key: a steward is the "ward" of what belongs to someone else.

Stewardship is not about occasional acts of generosity, or now and then making contributions to good causes. It's not even about money; it goes deeper than that. The core of stewardship is seeing things differently. Seeing everything with new eyes.

It's not complicated. We simply realize that everything we have, our existence, our life, our goods no matter how we got them, all come from God and belong to God, and we are stewards of all this. Once we see it that way, we live it that way. We try to administer well God's goods on behalf of God. That's what stewardship is.
